

## **Congressional Nuclear Security Working Group to Hold Briefing on Upcoming NPR on August 31st**

On **Thursday, August 31 from 2:30-3:30** the Congressional Nuclear Security Working Group will be holding a briefing on the upcoming Nuclear Posture Review. The briefing will be held in **Rayburn 2362-B**.

In January President Trump ordered a review of the U.S. nuclear posture. The on-going Nuclear Posture Review will establish U.S. nuclear policy, strategy, capabilities, and force structure for the next 5-10 years. To discuss the NPR process, previous reviews, and what we can expect from this iteration, the Working Group has organized a briefing and discussion with nuclear policy experts **Dr. Susan Koch** (National Defense University, former NSC, DOD, DOS) and Col. Guy Roberts (USMC, Ret., nominee for Assistant Secretary of Defense for Nuclear, Chemical and Biological Defense Programs).
